Today, Vision of Hope is stepping forward to support parents in our school communities by leading, funding, and implementing a **Parent Leadership**

and Family Engagement Program. By investing in parent engagement programs, using the best practices in parent, family, and community engagement, our goal is to develop a network of parent leaders who will become deeply invested in their children's academic success and school sustainability.

One of our primary partners for this initiative is the Conrad N. Hilton Foundation in Southern California, which recently awarded Vision of Hope a two-year grant to fund a significant portion of the program for our five schools in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.

We are deeply grateful for their support, generosity and belief in our mission.

school year. We see this program as a lasting hallmark for Vision of Hope, representing an investment in the future of our schools and the mission of the Dominican Sisters of Mission San Jose.

Leading this effort is Danny Diaz, who was recently hired as Vision of Hope's Program Manager for Parent Leadership and Engagement. In this role, Danny will work closely with the principals and pastors of each school to develop and implement the program, and work with parent leaders who have a shared interest in seeing their school grow and improve. Danny will also be working with Sister Georgette Coloumbe, O.P. to establish a team of Dominican Born in El Salvador, Danny Diaz was ten years old when his family emigrated to the United States and settled in Los Angeles.

"My mom instilled in me the value of education," Danny says. "I worked hard to graduate from high school with honors and pursue college; however, I wasn't awarded any scholarships due to my immigration status, so I worked and studied full-time."

Through personal experience and his professional life, Danny has seen that parental involvement leads to student success.

"I want to model the positive influence my mom had on me for our Vision of Hope students."

Danny's extensive experience in Catholic education has prepared him for this role, having worked as a Consultant for five Catholic schools in the Los Angeles area and as a Family Engagement Liaison for the Catholic Schools Collaborative (CSC) supporting multi-school efforts to deliver workshops in the areas of academics, technology, parent engagement, and socio-emotional support. Danny shares his vision for the coming year, "My strategy is to customize the program by prioritizing needs and cultivating relationships with parents so that they can use their voice to support and advocate for their children and their school community."

Prior to his work with CSC, Danny devoted five years to St. Aloysius Catholic School

sisters to work more closely with each Vision of Hope school on faith formation and support the principal in nurturing the Dominican charism more deeply. in Los Angeles as the Director of Marketing and Development. His wife, Mariana, teaches 5th grade at St. Aloysius and leads its middle school STEM program, and their children, Thiago, 2, and Cecilia, 5, attend preschool and TK there.
