In 1995 – a time when many religious orders were closing their schools – the Dominican Sisters of Mission San Jose decided to bolster eight of their most economically challenged elementary schools through dedicated support in fundraising and development. This is the “creation story” of Vision of Hope – born out of a dream that the Dominican Sisters of Mission San Jose set forth – and continues to unfold today. Where this dream takes us, we do not know, but we know if it’s God’s vision, it will not disappoint.

The 2021-2022 year moved us another step forward toward that vision. Much of our year was focused on the successful completion of our *Delivering on a Dream* campaign in memory of Sister John Martin Fixa, who, along with our Dominican Sisters, continues to light the way.

In addition, our schools returned to in-person instruction and began the challenging task of recovering and rebuilding following the peak of the pandemic. As we end our fiscal year, we are proud to share that our principals and teachers led with grace, courage, and generosity, and in doing so, 1,430 students completed their school year and 167 eighth graders graduated from a Vision of Hope school. In addition, through our new parent engagement program, we are now building relationships with over 500 parents across our five Los Angeles schools, and will expand this work to our Bay Area schools this year.

This year’s report highlights the ways Vision of Hope and our eight schools are *Delivering on a Dream*, and reminds us that this dream is part of God’s vision and world, which “does not disappoint.” The vision still has its time and presses us so that all are welcome at our schools, and no one is turned away.

Thank you for being with us during this extraordinary time and for deepening your commitment to Catholic education and our Vision of Hope schools. Thank you for your friendship, your prayers, and your continuing financial support as we continue *Delivering on a Dream*.

DELIVERING ON A DREAM CAMPAIGN

Vision of Hope Delivers on Sister Johnnie's Dream!

In January 2020, Vision of Hope launched the Delivering on a Dream Campaign, in memory of our dear friend Sister John Martin Fixa, O.P.

Our goal was to raise \$5M by July 31, 2022, to ensure Vision of Hope's mission and celebrate the dream that Sister Johnnie and the Dominican Sisters of Mission San Jose ignited 25 years ago.

Today, we are thrilled to share that we have raised 90%, or \$4.5M of this goal, and will be investing these funds directly into our schools over the next three years.

With these new funds, we will increase Tuition Assistance Funding by 28% and spend \$1.4M on tuition assistance in the coming 22-23 school year.

We are funding a three-year Technology and Innovation Program serving seven Vision of Hope schools.* This program builds on an existing partnership

between Vision of Hope and Loyola Marymount University's Institute for Digital Education and Leadership. Over the next three years, teachers and principals will be trained and coached in the best practices of personalized instruction, using data to drive instruction, and integrating technology into the classroom.

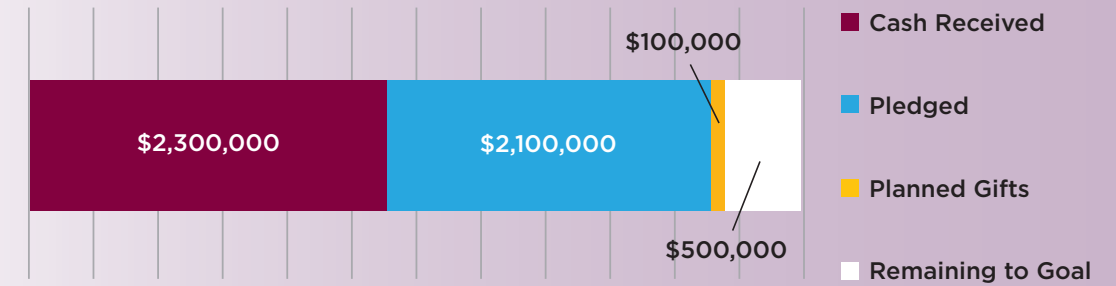
Finally, the campaign is also funding our new Parents in Action Program or PIA. Through the generous funds of the Conrad N. Hilton Foundation, we

first launched the PIA Program in 2021 for our five schools in Los Angeles. Led by Program Director, Danny Diaz, Vision of Hope offers workshops and resources to build the capacity of parents to better support their child's learning and become a leader in the school community. Through additional campaign funds, we can now expand this program to serve all eight schools over the next three years.

*St. Elizabeth Elementary already partners in this program through their diocesan school network, Lumen Christi Academies.

PIA PROGRAM

Parents in Action Evolves in our Los Angeles schools

Over the last year, VOH successfully established its Parent Leadership and Family Engagement Program and officially named it the *Parents in Action* or PIA Program.

This name captures the concept of mobilizing parents for learning and action and recalls the name of Mother Pia Backes, the foundress of the Dominican Sisters of Mission San Jose.

Treasuring the Dominican charism and faithful to Mother Pia's vision, the goal of the program is to strengthen parent engagement, knowledge, and confidence so families can better support their children's academic careers and be more active in the school community.

In its first year, the PIA Program offered a menu of workshops to over 500 parents in collaboration with community partners

who share in our mission. These workshops prioritized topics such as social and emotional learning, preparing your child for high school and college, financial literacy, and leadership development.

The PIA Program has also become a bridge between the Dominican Sisters, their affiliated schools, and their education ministry.

Over the last year, the nine sisters that make up the Dominican Sisters Outreach Team (DSOT) have rejoiced at the opportunity to reconnect with our families. They have visited schools, joined students virtually for weekly Gospel reflections, carried out presentations around the topics of Advent and Lent, and hosted various other activities. Their kind hearts and love are a fountain of hope and renewed faith for our network of schools and families.



ST. FRANCES X. CABRINI SCHOOL'S CONSULTATIVE SCHOOL BOARD

New Board Strengthens St. Frances X. Cabrini

Since the founding of Vision of Hope 27 years ago, development directors and their boards have been key to sustaining and growing our eight elementary schools. One of our southern schools, St. Frances X. Cabrini, is the first to see its development board transition to a consultative school board. This new board serves as an advisory body to Principal Carmen Orinoco-Hart and the parish pastor, Father Juan Bosco.

In 2019, members of the Cabrini development board decided that they needed a broader focus than just fund raising, says Lynne Hook, inaugural School Board Chair. "We wanted to have more community members, parents, alumni and parishioners on the board," she says. "Our goal was to have a locally motivated and supportive board."

The Archdiocese of Los Angeles has recommended that elementary schools pursue a consultative school board whose purpose is to "assist the school community in its essential goals of educating young people and passing on the Catholic faith and its traditions to students."

Peggy Grant, current school board chair, studied and modified the Archdiocesan sample constitution bylaws and school governance documents. The sample suggests several committees that a board might establish. Lynne says. "We settled on five committees: Building/Grounds & Community Relations, Education & Mission Effectiveness, Finance, Development, and Executive."

Members were then recruited, and the new St. Frances X. Cabrini School Board began meeting in 2020 on Zoom, just as the pandemic forced schools to transition to virtual instruction and learning. Lynne believes the timing was fortuitous, because the board was able to help Principal Hart navigate all the new challenges that Covid presented. "We helped establish policies and procedures, and also served as a sounding board," she says.

The SFXC school board has been meeting in person since June 2021. Current board members are Peggy Grant, Lynne Hook, Dan Annarelli, Teresa Carlson, Paco Cartagena, Jon Rager, Kathy

Rowland, Angel Santiago, Nelson Santos, Allyson Simpson, Vanessa Reyes-Smith and Deirdre Smith.

In the coming months and years, Lynne believes a major focus of the school board should be on academics and data in order to ensure that Cabrini graduates are ready for a Catholic high school and college prep environment.

Jon Rager, a CPA who chairs the board's finance committee, says his committee's goal is to establish an annual budget and reasonable cash forecasts. Jon hopes the school board can foster "full involvement of parishioners to understand what an opportunity the school is to evangelize and build a community of kids and parents."

"I know that St. Frances X. Cabrini is a stronger school as a result of this school board structure," says Vision of Hope Executive Director Ann Magovern. "Our other schools, development boards and stakeholders have much to learn from the SFXC experience."

JOHN MCKENNA ON THE MCKENNA FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

The Generational Gift of Catholic Education

Growing up a few blocks from St. Philip Elementary in San Francisco, you would think that is where you would have found the McKenna children – but the family’s long history at **St. James School**, provided an enduring blessing, not just for the McKennas, but for the students attending St. James today and in the future.

Vision of Hope donor John McKenna, recently sat down with us to share the story of his family’s almost century-long connection to St. James. Through his mother Juliana, the family has been involved with St. James since the school moved into its current location on Fair Oaks Street in 1927. Juliana O’Brien McKenna, and all her siblings, attended St. James, as did all five McKenna children—John, Joyce, Jackie, Bill and Mike.

John’s father, John Sr., was a San Francisco

police officer, who was often called on by friends and neighbors, even after work hours, to mentor the neighborhood kids and keep them on the straight and narrow. The McKenna parents truly lived the call of Christian discipleship, even ‘adopting’ children from other countries to support them as they could through missionary appeals, always sharing what little they had for the benefit of others in need. Juliana and John Sr. worked hard, sometimes taking on additional jobs, to ensure that their children enjoyed the benefits of a foundational Catholic education.

Because his parents placed such a high value on Catholic education, John feels he has experienced a lifetime of benefits. He noted, “It all started in the little building at 321 Fair Oaks – St. James School.” Due to John’s academic strengths, particularly in reading, John skipped 6th grade. His teacher, Sister Barbara Darby, O.P., encouraged John’s parents to have him apply to the formidable St. Ignatius College Preparatory High School. John credits his preparation for the rigor of the Jesuit education to his excellent instructional experience at St. James. John graduated from St. James in 1972, St. Ignatius in 1976, and went on to earn a degree from Santa Clara University.

In 2018, John contacted the development director at St. James to ask what the current cost of a Catholic education at St. James was. He learned that over the years as the balance of income in the neighborhood had changed, the families of St. James were now much more economically challenged, and that most of them required financial support to continue their children’s education at St. James School.



As John and his siblings sought to establish a scholarship in their parent’s name, they looked to serve two purposes. First, they wished to honor Juliana and John Sr., whose unfailing generosity, and commitment to Catholic education, had reaped such benefits. “What moved our parents, was making sure that the ‘little ones’ were cared for,” said John. Second, they wished to help provide the same opportunities their parents had worked so hard to provide for them, “to ensure that other children could have the gift of a quality Catholic education, receive strong faith formation, and grow in a supportive and nurturing environment.”

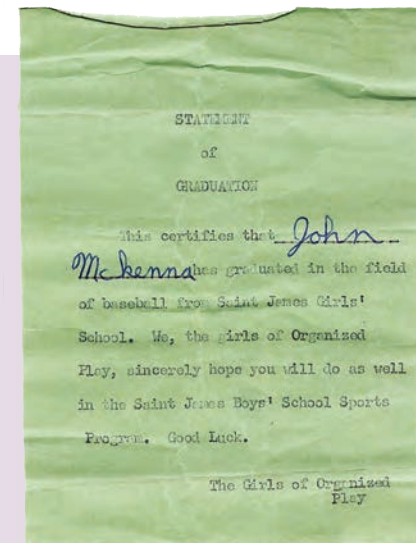
The following year, the **McKenna Family Scholarship** was created to provide financial assistance to students who “exhibit a strong and joyful development in the Catholic faith, persevere in being the best student possible and show care and concern for their schoolmates.” The amount and number of scholarships is determined each year by the McKenna family and the administration of St. James School.

We honor the McKenna family connection to St. James through the dedicated work of our teachers and staff. The generosity of John and the McKenna family helps many St. James’ families secure Catholic education for the next generation of “little ones”. — Alex Endo, Principal, St. James School

John shares, “St. James has been at the core of our lives, and serving the current and future needs of children in San Francisco’s Mission District is what we do. Our parents believed that each child’s life is of great value, and if we can make it better, even in a small way, I think that honors our parents, and their commitment to that vision.”

In the early 1970’s, St. James School was divided into two campuses — St. James Girls School (1st thru 8th), and St. James Boys School (4th thru 8th). St. James boys spent their first few years learning at the Girls School. When the young men completed 3rd grade, they ‘graduated’ to the Boys School. Luckily for John McKenna, the **St. James Girls of Organized Play** sent a typed note letting the Boys School know John had successfully graduated from their baseball program and wished him well with his future athletic endeavors!

Financial Highlights of Fiscal Year 2021-2022

We are especially grateful for the many friends and foundation partners who generously supported our *Delivering on a Dream* campaign. In the last 30 months, donors have given \$2.3M in cash, pledged \$2.1M, and we received \$100,000 in planned gifts, totaling \$4.5 million.

For this year's revenue, our total income was \$1,483,697 and 51% of this was campaign revenue. In terms of expenses, we spent \$1.5 million in tuition assistance and services to our schools.

- Schools received grants which ranged from \$133,000-\$158,000 per school
- \$340,149 was spent on the Parents in Action Program and Blended Learning Initiatives

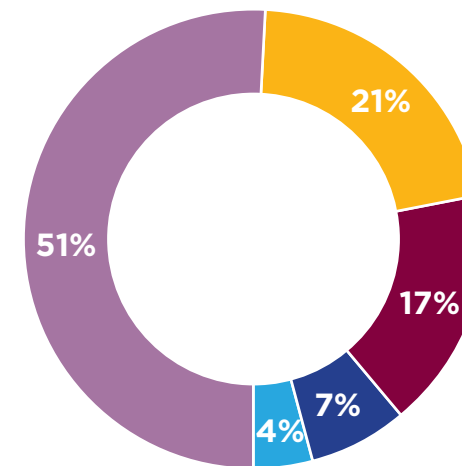
Along with the overall stock and bond markets,

The endowment account was down -3.65% net of all fees for the fiscal year ending July 31st, 2022, and the non-endowed scholarship account was down -5.84% after fees. This compares to a decline of 4.64% for the S&P 500 Index and -7.23% for the 3-5-year Corporate Bond Index.

Despite these declines, Vision of Hope's total assets remain strong and are valued at \$16,153,664 as of July 31, 2022.

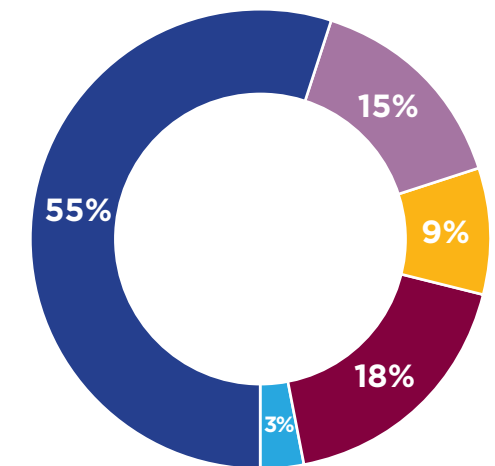

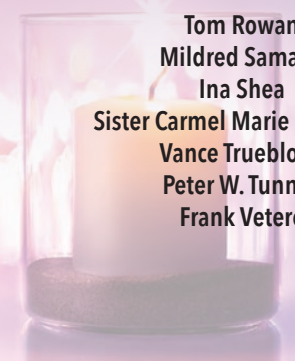
