#### LOS ANGELES SCHOOLS

#### Sacred Heart

Four Sacred Heart 8th graders were awarded a competitive scholarships through the Onward Scholars Program. In addition to a scholarship covering 75% of the students' high school tuition, the program promotes scholarship, mentorship, and college access. Awardees were: Bryan Nguyen (Cathedral High School), Ignacio Chaparro (Bishop Mora Salesian High School), Nadya Rocha (Sacred Heart High School), Lizeth Rivas (Sacred Heart High School).

#### **Santa Teresita**

Santa Teresita successfully piloted their first transitional kindergarten program and have a class for the upcoming school year. Santa Teresita was also selected to participate in the LMU's Center for Catholic Education's Fostering Culture for Educating the Whole Child: Spiritual, Social, Emotional, Mental Wellness. The LA Department of Catholic Schools also selected Santa Teresita to become a Solidarity School, which is a three-year program focused on delivering high-quality instructional resources in Literacy and Math.

#### St. Frances X. Cabrini

Many applied, few were chosen! Congratulations to scholarship recipients for Loyola's 2023 Summer Session: Gerald Castrodes, 7th gr., Jadden Herrera, 6th gr., & Mauro Tejada, 7th gr. These students received full scholarships based on their strong academic achievement and were recognized as "Top Performers" by the Director of Summer Scholarships and his committee.

#### St. Ignatius of Loyola

Students are thriving at Loyola! 8th grader, Holly Barrientos, received the full four year San Miguel Scholarship given by La Salle High School. Rising Senior, Karyme Morales, St. Ignatius Class of 2020, is spending the summer at Columbia University, where she earned an internship in science and technology and is pursuing her dream of becoming a Disney Imagineer. Former St. Ignatius student and teacher, Allison Nava, earned her Doctorate in Urban Education from Loyola Marymount University this past Spring. Owen Chacon (St. Ignatius class of 2019) will be attending the University of Notre Dame this coming fall.

#### St. Michael's

After 7 years St. Michael's enrollment went back up to 300, with middle school classes (6th - 7th grade) having more than 35 students per class. New Development Director, Colleen Consola, started in August, got acquainted with donors, sent out an appeal, and raised over \$30K. Shea Family Charities is returning to St. Michael's to renovate the cafeteria, auditorium, music room, and library.

#### St. Elizabeth



Through Ms. Corona's dedication and belief in the potential of all her students, 67% of the class are now at or above grade level!

## Parents in Action (PiA): Empowering Families

Vision of Hope's newest program, Parents in Action (PiA), is growing and empowering families! Apart from offering personal development workshops and learning opportunities, PiA Program Director Danny Diaz recruited parent leaders to join Vision of Hope's first *Parent Advisory Council (PAC)* and contracted *Family Liaisons* at each of our Los Angeles schools. While PAC promotes communication and directly links families to VOH, our Family Liaisons act as a local point of contact for PiA and assist in promoting activities and driving participation. Most recently, nine of our parents joined leaders from across the country in a three-day institute to grow their leadership skills and learn to leverage power to drive change for students and families in our communities.
