Since 1974, National Catholic Schools Week has been the annual celebration of Catholic education in the United States. This year, the festivities ran from January 28–February 3 with the theme "Catholic Schools: United in Faith and Community." Our schools observed the week with Masses and activities based on daily themes that engaged students, families, faculty, staff, parishioners, and community members. The focus was on the value Catholic education provides to young people as well as the impact on our church, communities, and nation.

Our schools and students honored their commitment to Catholic education and showcased their creative skills as they celebrated the week. Schools kicked off the week with Family Mass on Sunday. St. Elizabeth School filled the church with devout families, while St. Anthony-Immaculate Conception School offered a pancake brunch following Mass. Vision of Hope's Sister Georgette Coulombe, O.P. visited St. Michael's School via video conference, leading their morning "Gospel Monday" as students participated in their pajamas for Pajama Day. It bridges a communication gap that often limits students from continuing their Catholic
